This year we will use the Horsereg system for event registrations:



Divisions¹

Horse Masters – Over 25 years of age, horsemaster members.

Senior — A level or less can be any PC member in good standing. — National Qualifier

Intermediate – Less than B level, must be 20 years of age or less. – National Qualifier

Intermediate Entry – 12-18 years old, maximum C level, 1st year in intermediate

Junior – Less than C level and must be 13 years of age or less.

Junior Entry – 10-15 years old, untested, never competed at quiz, 1st or 2nd year in CPC

Snurf — E and D level (NOT D1 or D2) must be 9 years of age or younger.

Ages as of January 1st, 2024

The member's Stable Management (SM) level will be used to determine a member's Quiz level. Note that those individuals that have achieved B level are expected to sign up for the Senior level of Quiz competition.

Participants in the intermediate and senior divisions may qualify for National Quiz. To qualify for National quiz, individual scores have to be at or over 50% (or an overall score of 35 and up).

¹ If numbers warrant divisions may be combined or not offered. This will be at the organizer's discretion.

Teams

Teams will be made up of 3 or 4 individuals with the 3 best individual scores used to calculate the team score. Individuals and couples can enter, and we will do our best to find teammates.

Senior teams will be made up of 2 or 3 individuals, with the two best individual scores used to calculate the team score.

Volunteers

Two adult volunteers per team or one per partial team is required for the smooth running of the day. Please fill in the name of the volunteer on your registration. No team will be accepted without a volunteer.

Any member that needs help with reading must have a **volunteer reader** named on the registration for each child needing help. All readers will be put in a pool and will help members from other branches.

In addition, Snurf and Junior Entry teams have to be accompanied by a chaperone to ensure that they will find and complete all components of the quiz. Those chaperoning teams will not be allowed to assist participants in any of the quiz components.

Awards²

Individuals

Snurf to Intermediate Rosettes to 10th
Senior and HM Rosettes to 6th

Teams

Snurf to Intermediate Placings to 5th Senior and HM Placings to 3rd

Ties – ties will be broken based on written scores, then on ID scores. The written tests may include tie breaker questions as well.

This Quiz will be conducted according to the Regional and National Rules for Quiz. Make sure to wear your **Pony Club pin** with appropriate disk!

Bring your **passport** to be signed by the Regional Quiz Chair. Those that hand in their passport at the start of Quiz will earn an extra mark on their written test!

Please be advised that the use of phones, tablets and other electronic devices will **NOT** be allowed on the premises during the **complete** duration of the Quiz (this includes the lunch break). Make sure to leave these devices at home or hand them to your parent at the start of the Quiz.

² Prizes and ribbons will be awarded as numbers warrant and may differ from what is expressed here.

Use of these devices will receive the same penalty as unsportsmanlike conduct. This includes the chaperones!

There are three basic components of quiz:

Written test 40 marks - individual Visual identification 30 marks - individual Games 30 marks - team

Team score is made up out of all three components: Written tests, Visual ID and Games. Individual scores are calculated out of the Written test and Visual ID.

The first two elements are individual efforts and as such contestants will be penalized for any intent to communicate during the tests and eliminated for a second infraction. Any unsportsmanlike behavior, disrespect towards other contestants, volunteers, officials or the facility by a contestant or their parent will incur immediate elimination and removal from the facility. Entry fee will not be refunded.

Written test – The knowledge base that is tested may include any information from required or resource materials indicated for that Pony Club test level in the Pony Club Testing Procedures. General wording of questions will be age and level appropriate and may include Canadian Pony Club acronyms and abbreviations, discipline rules and stable management. Please note that the British and U.S. manuals will be used as a final reference and therefore in cases where different answers are given, those from these manuals will be accepted as correct. The written test can include but is not limited to multiple choice, true and false, short and long answer questions.

Visual Identification – This part of Quiz can include any information from required or resource reading indicated for that quiz level. Items may include items or pictures of tack (English and Western), riding apparel, horse care items, veterinary items and feeds. Intermediate and Senior levels can also include the following: driving tack, farrier equipment, teeth, plants, and parasites.

Games – Games are designed to promote team spirit and cooperation. In all games conferring and encouragement are essential. All games have equal weighting and so contribute to the final team mark. All games are timed and may take up to 10 minutes.
