- Awards** Dressage and Jumping divisional prizes first thru third
Individual class placings first thru sixth for each dressage test and jumper round
Medals and prizes first thru third for Medals, Freestyle/Pas de Deux/Drill
Overall weekend high point by Pony Club level (E thru A/B)
Overall weekend team placings by Pony Club level (E/D, A/B/C)
Sportsmanship Award for each day (by nomination)
Best Turnout for E/D and ABC for each day
- Eligibility** Competitors must enter appropriately labelled dressage division, and jumper division no lower than 3" below tested riding height to be eligible for level awards, and divisional awards.
- Open Classes** Open to Horse Masters, and Pony Clubbers wishing to compete below the requirements for their level high point. Open Division High Point will be awarded.
- Tack and Dress** Helmets and gloves are required to be worn while mounted. Arm bands are required to be worn on the arm while mounted. Failure to do so will result in elimination. Boots with heels are required (either tall boots or paddock boots with matching colored half chaps with a zipper or continuous Velcro). Riders are expected to be dressed neat and tidy: light colored (tan or white) breeches with a collared shirt with rat catcher or tie (no choker pins for jumping) and dark jacket. Pony Club pins with level disc should be worn on left lapel. Jackets may be waived, or rain jackets allowed, at judge's discretion. Horses and ponies should be braided and well turned out. Competitor must braid their own horse or pony to be eligible for Best Turnout Award. Costumes are optional for Freestyle, Pas de Deux, and Drill classes. Hard and/or inflatable body protector vests may be worn for any portion of the competition on the outside of other garments. Inflatable body protector's may be worn without a hard vest for dressage and show jumping. Body protector's must meet or exceed ASTM F1937 or BETA Level 3 safety standard.
- Appeals/Protests/Objections** Any protests are to be handled according to the CPC National Show Jump Rulebook and CPC National Dressage Rulebook. See 8.4.2 of the Dressage rulebook, and 1.7.3 of the Show Jump rulebook. In the spirit of good sportsmanship, appeals, protests, and objections are discouraged.
- Volunteers** As this is a volunteer run event, each participant/competitor is expected to provide a volunteer for a minimum 4-hour volunteer shift. See following page for volunteer role descriptions and experience needed.

First Aid	Fri – 4pm-day end Sat – 8am-day end Sun – 8am-day end	Provide first aid in the event of falls and injuries on the competition grounds; must work with safety officer to fill in incident reports; clear any competitor to return to competition after a fall	Minimum Standard First Aid with CPR C and AED
Safety Officer	Fri – 4pm-day end Sat – 8am-day end Sun – 8am-day end	Handles incident reports (falls, injuries, etc.); arranges and facilitates appropriate personnel for incidents	Knowledge of safety procedures and incident management needed
Warm Up Supervisor	Fri – 5pm-day end Sat – 8am-day end Sun – 8am-day end	Supervise warm up ring; ensure safety of competitors; enforce safety rules	None
Parking Attendant	Fri – 12pm-5pm Sat – 8am-12pm Sun – 8am-12pm	Organize and direct trailers and cars to appropriate parking areas	None
Whipper In	Sat – 8am-day end Sun – 8am-day end	Open and close arena gates; as a courtesy, call competitors to the gate for their ride times in the correct order (it is the competitor's responsibility to get to the competition arena at the scheduled time); alert the judge to any scratches	None
Safety Tack Check	Sat – 8am-day end Sun – 8am-day end	Check tack/dress meets CPC General Rules Supplemental for safety and permitted equipment	Knowledge of allowed tack/dress required
Announcer	Sat – 8am-day end Sun – 8am-day end	Announce rider and horse name as they enter the competition arena; announce faults at end of round for jumpers; start music for freestyles; record time from electronics timers for jumpers	None
Scribes	Sat – 8am-day end	Write comments and scores for dressage judge; act as judge's assistant; refrain from commenting on competitors	Familiarity with dressage and some experience an asset
Runners	Sat – 8am-day end	Pick up tests from judge and return to the scorers throughout the day	None
Jump Crew	Sun – 8am-day end	Replace poles when knocked down during a class; assist with course changes; ** this role requires the volunteer to focus and be attentive to the job for the entirety of the shift	None
Timers	Sun – 8am-day end	Act as back-up to the electronic timing system; start/stop timer as competitor crosses start/finish lines; report time to judge/announcer	Some experience an asset
Friday Set Up	Fri – 5pm-done	Assist in set up of Dressage rings	None
Saturday Set Up	Sat – 5pm-done	Assist in tear down of Dressage rings, set up of jump courses for next day	None
Sunday Tear Down	Sun – 4pm-done	Assist in tear down of jump courses	None

Jumper Division Breakdown – Ring 1

Division	Height	Eligibility
1 – Ground Pole Jumper	3 poles on ground	E/D
2 – Cross Pole Jumper	0.5m, cross rails only	E/D/D1
3 – Open I Jumper	3 poles on ground or 0.5m, cross rails only	D1 and above, Horse Masters
4 – Starter Jumper	0.6m, verticals only	D1 and below
5 – Pre-Entry Jumper	0.7m	D2 and below
6 – Open II Jumper	Starter or Pre-Entry	D2 and above, Horse Masters
7 – Entry Jumper I	0.75m	C and below
8 – 2'6 Medals	2'6"	C and below

Jumper Division Breakdown – Ring 2

Division	Height	Eligibility
9 – Entry Jumper II	0.75m	C and below
10 – Novice Jumper	0.85m	C1 and below
11 – Open III Jumper	0.75m or 0.85m	C and above, Horse Masters
12 – Schooling Jumper	0.90m	C2 and below
13 – Junior Jumper	1.00m	Open
14 – Open Jumper IV	0.90m or 1.00m	A/B, Horse Masters
15 – Championship Jumper	1.10m, higher heights available by request	Open
16 – BCLM National Medals Qualifier	3'0"	Open

Jumper Divisions

- 1 “Match Time” round – closest to the optimum time with the fewest faults wins
- 1 “Championship” round – jumper round, followed by timed jump off if the competitor has no faults in the jumper round; fastest jump off time with fewest faults wins

Medals Divisions

- Equitation jumper round – jump round not against the clock, judged on equitation and quality of round
- Flat class – equitation on the rail class for top 12 from equitation jumper round
