Entry fees, less \$10.00 administration fee, will be refunded for cancellations due to injury or illness of the horse or rider if the Show Secretary was notified the day of the show and a signed veterinarian's or doctor's certificate must be received by the show organizer within 5 days following the show.
- 5. Entry Forms:** Entry Forms, Signed Release Forms, and Cheques for all entries from your club must be **received by Tuesday Sept 5th, 2017**. **There will be \$30 admin fee for each club entry. This fee will be refunded by cheque to the branch on the day of the show if COMPLETE entry package and payment are received by the deadline.**

- 9. DC or Designate** If the District Commissioner of a competing branch cannot be present at this show, he or she must inform the show organizer or secretary, in writing, of the person to be his or her representative.
- 10. Rulings/Protests** In all matters, the decision of the judge and/or show committee is final. No verbal protests will be accepted. Written protests only (submitted by the D.C. or designate), accompanied by \$50.00 **cash** (to be refunded if protest sustained), are to be presented to the ground jury within 30 minutes of announcement of scores.
- 11. Property rules:** The stable areas are out of bounds to all entrants and visitors
- All vehicles must remain in the designated areas
 - No dogs allowed
 - No Smoking allowed near stable area and near riding rings

An Emergency Medical Service will be on site. A Veterinarian and a Farrier will be on call.

The following divisions will be offered at each qualifying show and at the regional finals:

3. Medals round

Each of the qualifying divisions will offer the following classes in this order:

1. ATM5 round – Scored by fault and time penalties incurred during the round. First round ties are broken by a jump off. Jump Off ties are broken by the time of the first round.
2. Power and speed round – Two parts to the course: If the “power” portion is completed without any jumping faults, then the rider continues to complete the “speed” portion as quickly as possible.
3. Medals round – Two rounds: Equitation over fences (60% component) and on the flat (40% component)

Horsemasters:

Horsemasters are encouraged to enter. Please contact organizers with your interest. The number of entries and desired heights will determine divisions and awards. Please note HM under PC Level on entry form.

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. This show is open to all tested Pony Club Members and affiliate members in good standing who meet the division eligibility. Their entry forms must be signed by their District Commissioner to verify that they are showing at their correct Pony Club Level.
2. Order of Classes: Pre-Entry Divisions (A1, A2, B and Schooling)
 1. Warm-Up Round
 2. Class 1 - Single Round with Jump Off (Table AM5)
 3. Class 2 - Jumper Medal Class
Entry, Starter, Adv. Starter, Beginner, Novice, Intermediate and Advanced Divisions
 1. Class 1 - Single Round with Jump Off (Table AM5)
 2. Class 2 - Power and Speed (Table A)
 3. Class 3 - Jumper Medal Class
3. This competition is governed by the Current Equine Canada Hunter/Jumper Rule Book and the National and Central Ontario Show Jumping Rules.
4. A horse may be entered only once per show in the qualifying divisions but the same horse may be entered in Pre-Entry A and Pre-Entry B (non-qualifying divisions) with different riders. Rider may cross enter divisions (i.e. a rider may enter two different divisions on two different horses).
5. It is Mandatory that all persons mounted on a horse/pony anywhere on the competition grounds wear ASTM/SEI approved protective headgear secured with a safety harness permanently affixed to the helmet. Hard soled, heeled boots must be worn while riding. Whips not exceeding 75 cm in length may be carried in all classes.
6. There is a **Mandatory Tack Check** at the start of every division, as well as random checks being made throughout the course of the day. If the tack person finds any safety concern with a competitor's tack, they will not be allowed to compete until it has been corrected.
7. If the District Commissioner of a competing branch cannot be present at this show, he or she must inform the show organizer or secretary, in writing, of the person to be his or her representative.
8. Neither the Canadian Pony Club, host Pony Club(s), staff organizers, Property Owners nor any person acting on their behalf, shall be held liable for any loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, riders, spectators, or any other persons or property whatsoever.
9. In all matters, the decision of the judge and/or show committee is final. No verbal protests will be accepted. Written protests only (submitted by the D.C. or designate), accompanied by \$50.00 (cash to be refunded if protest sustained), are to be present to the ground jury within 30 minutes of announcement of scores.
10. Please become familiar with the Central Ontario Region Policy on Rules, Safety/Turn-Out and Abuse of Officials/Volunteers. Anyone (child, parent, coach, etc) verbally protesting to anyone other than the ground jury may incur elimination of the associated rider from the competition.
11. **Schooling Over the Course** is not allowed under any circumstance before, during, or after the competition.
12. Unauthorized assistance will result in the rider being disqualified.
13. **Pony Club pins with appropriate coloured disk must be worn. In addition, the Medical Arm Band must be worn on the arm, not on the leg, horse, etc.**
14. Additional Rules:
 - The stable areas are out of bounds to all entrants and visitors
 - All vehicles must remain in the designated areas
 - No Dogs Allowed
 - No Smoking allowed in stable area or near riding rings
 - No one is to be mounted other than competitors

JUMPER MEDAL CLASSES

Equitation, by definition, is the effectiveness or skill of the rider. It is judged on position, overall display of control, and good riding skills. The riders will be asked to complete a jumper course to be judged on equitation. From these riders the judge will bring back 6-12 riders to complete the flat phase. These numbers will be decided based on numbers in the class and time constraints of the show. If there are fewer than 6 riders in the class those competitors that have completed the over fences phase without elimination, they will all return for the flat phase.

The following are some of the things that you will be asked to do in your respective divisions:

Pre-Entry A Walk, trot rising, trot sitting, halt, change of direction at walk or trot, walk on a loose rein.

Pre-Entry B and Schooling Walk, with or without stirrups, trot rising and sitting, halt, change of direction at walk or trot, and walk on a loose rein. Canter in groups at judge's discretion, no more than 6 at one time, i.e. only if judge feels it is safe.

Entry Walk, with or without stirrups, trot rising and sitting with and without stirrups, halt, change of direction, and walk on a loose rein, canter in groups no more than 10 per group.

Starter/Adv Starter Walk, trot rising and sitting, with or without stirrups, halt, change of direction at walk or trot, and walk on a loose rein, canter in groups no more than 12 at one time.

Beginner Walk, trot rising and sitting with or without stirrups, halt, change of direction at walk or trot, and walk on a loose rein, trot on long rein, canter in groups no more than 12. Show a lengthen of stride at trot.

Novice Walk, trot rising and sitting with or without stirrups, halt, change of direction at walk or trot, canter with or without stirrups, show a lengthen of stride at trot and canter.

Intermediate Walk, trot rising and sitting, canter, all with or without stirrups, halt, change of direction at walk or trot or canter, show simple change of lead at trot, walk and trot on loose rein, extended trot rising, lengthen stride at canter.

Advanced As above, with extended trot, collected trot, extended canter, collected canter and counter canter.

Acceptance of Risk Form

Every entry at a **Central Ontario Regional Show Jumping** competition shall constitute an agreement that the person making it; owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, rider, and the horse shall be subject to the Constitution and the Rules of the Canadian Pony Club, Equine Canada, and the local rules of the Competition, and that every horse/rider is eligible as entered and that the owner and any of his representatives are bound by the Constitution and Rules of the Canadian Pony Club, Equine Canada and the Competition; accept as final the decision of the hearing committee/ ground jury on any questions arising under said rules and agree to hold the Competition, Canadian Pony Club, Equine Canada, their officials, directors and employees harmless for any action taken.

Effective January 1, 2003, Equine Canada required that Junior competitors wear proper fitting, approved protective headgear, with the safety harness correctly secured, at all times while mounted on competition or event grounds. Approved headgear meets the ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials) standards and displays the SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) seal. The British standard, BSI, is also acceptable. It is understood that if the competitor does not meeting this requirement that s/he will not be allowed to compete at these competitions.

I, _____ (competitor's name), do hereby certify that I, the undersigned, have read and understand the rules governing this show/competition and hereby agree to abide by them. I recognize that all equestrian sports involve inherent risk and that no helmet or protective equipment can protect against all foreseeable injury. I hereby accept this risk and hold harmless the Canadian Pony Club, Equine Canada, the facility, competition, officials, organizers, agents, employees and their representatives. Neither the Canadian Pony Club, host Pony Club(s), Staff, Organizers, Property Owners nor any person acting on their behalf, shall be held liable for any loss, damage, injury, or illness to horses, riders, spectators or any other persons or property whatsoever.

Statement of Principle Equine Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices;
- Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition;
- Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.
