Spring Cleaning Checklist

It's that time of year again! The snow is beginning to melt away and reveal the mess left behind by colder months. There is so much to clean up that it can be overwhelming, so we put together a checklist of important areas to tackle to get you and your horse ready for spring!



- ☐ Clean, inspect, and repair/replace all tack and blankets
- ☐ Bathe, clip, and groom horse to help shed winter coat
- ☐ Wash and pack away winter blankets and get out fly masks and sheets
- ☐ Check first aid/emergency kit supplies and expiry dates and replace
- ☐ Disinfect buckets, feeders, and grooming tools
- ☐ Confirm spring vet appointments
- ☐ Check fields and pastures for dangers and check fencing
- ☐ Service and clean your horse trailer
- ☐ Schedule your spring vet appointments
- ☐ Mark your calendar with all upcoming shows and Pony Club events!

Do It Yourself

Stud Muffins

Ingredients

- 2 C carrots, shredded
- 1 C molasses
- 2 ½ C oats
- 2 Tbsp oil (any vegetable)

Directions

Mix all ingredients in a bowl. Roll into balls. Place on a cookie sheet and bake at 350°F for 20 minutes. Do not overbake. Let cool. Bring to the barn for your pony to enjoy!
