SATURDAY, MAY 15TH – HUNTER/JUMPER FUN DAY

Registration Fee: \$25 plus \$8 per class entered. (Entrants are encouraged to use the MREC cross country field for practice, as the \$25 entry covers their day fee.)

Show Office Open at 8:00 am
Classes begin at 9:00 am SHARP

- Open to all riders.
- Classes may be combined or divided depending on entry numbers.
- **POST ENTRY** is allowed at **\$15 per class**.
- Turn out to be neat and tidy, braiding and jackets are optional. White shirt or polo shirt tucked into breeches. **ASTM helmets** with a permanently attached harness, and boots with a heel are mandatory.
- Coaching is allowed. Coaches must adhere to page 16 of the CPC Show Jumping Rules. Coaching riders who are on course will constitute outside assistance, and may result in elimination.
- **Medical armbands must be worn at all times while mounted.**
- Show numbers to be worn at all times while mounted.
- Horses and ponies may only be shared between **2 riders**.
- Shared horses/ponies will be limited to **4 rounds per horse/rider combination**.
- **GREEN HORSE classes are open only to those horses showing in their 1st or 2nd year of showing.**
- Riders may enter multiple rounds (maximum 3) in same class. 1st round in each class with same horse/rider combination will count towards placing.
- Minimum 3 riders to run a class
- Tack check will be required.
- Awards: Ribbons to 8th place, prizes for 1st place

SATURDAY, MAY 15TH – MEDAL DIVISIONS

Registration Fee: \$80 per division (includes MREC day fee for use of MREC facilities)

Show Office Open at 8:00 am

- Entry is open to all British Columbia CPC members in good standing. Completed Pony Club passports must be presented at registration.
- All medal classes to be run under Canadian Pony Club Show Jumping Rules, 2010 version, available online at www.canadianponyclub.org. All riders are responsible for knowledge of the rules.
- There will be **2** divisions of medal classes run: **2'9" and 3'**. The 3' medal division is a qualifier for the National Show Jumping Championships 2012.
- 2'9" medal rounds will be done with a jumper equitation round, a flat ride as group, and a gymnastic round. There will be no ride off and no switch of horses.
- The 3' division Medal Class will be run as a full format 3' medal class with an individual flat ride, jumper equitation round, a gymnastic round and ride off for the top 4 riders. Ride off will consist of a switch ride.
- Flat ride will be indicated at least 2 weeks prior to show and chosen from CPC medal rides provided by the National Office.
- There will be a tack check before all phases at all heights.
- Tack to comply with CPC rules for medal classes.
- Separate turn out award for medal classes with all heights judged together as one turn out award.
- Coaching is allowed. Coaches must adhere to page 16 of the CPC Show Jumping Rules. Coaching riders who are on course will constitute outside assistance, and may result in elimination.
- Medical armbands must be worn at all times while mounted.
- Show numbers to be worn at all times while mounted.
- Minimum 3 riders to run a class
- Awards: Medals for top 3, Ribbons & Prizes to 6th

SCRATCH/WITHDRAWAL POLICY: Only with vet or doctor's note in Chairperson's hand within 48 hours of May 14, 2011. No faxed copies to MREC will be accepted. **Refund subject to \$40 administration fee.** Stabling is non-refundable.

SUNDAY, MAY 16TH – JUMPER CHAMPIONSHIPS

Registration Fee: \$80 per division (includes MREC day fee for use of MREC facilities)

Show Office Open at 8:00 am

Classes begin at 9:00 am SHARP

- Entry is open to all British Columbia CPC members in good standing. Completed Pony Club passports must be presented at registration.
- Pony and Horse Divisions will be combined, distances will not be changed. Points will be assigned to the separate divisions for placing purposes.
- Classes in 3', 3'3", and 3'6" divisions will include 1 class each of: Optimum Time; Power and Speed, Immediate Jump-Off and Equitation
- Classes in 2'6" and 2'9" divisions will have 2 classes of Immediate Jump-Off, 1 class of Optimum Time and 1 class of Equitation.
- There will be a 3' Pony Championship Division and a 3'6" Horse Championship Division.
- Ponies may be subject to measurement.
- Ponies allowed at higher height at discretion of DC and coach (will need recommendation from coach and DC sent in with entry – no exceptions)
- No division changes allowed after the closing date. Horse substitutions are allowed up to 3 days before the show with DC's approval.
- Riders are expected to be correctly and neatly attired as specified by Pony Club rules.
- ASTM helmets with a permanently attached harness, and boots with a heel are mandatory.
- Post Entry into additional classes will be allowed as long as previously registered in a division. Please see Waiver of Claims Form for information.
- **Post Entry** in lower divisions than originally registered will be judged hors concours – entrants will be judged as non-competitors. Cost is **\$20 per additional class**.
- Riders may enter with more than one horse; registration fee is per horse/rider combination.
- Division championship to be awarded to rider in each division with most points based on simple scoring of x amount of points for each placing.
- Ribbons will be presented in each class, with prizes for division winners.
- Turnout Awards to best turned out Pony and Horse.
- A Sportsmanship Award will be awarded to the Pony Club Member showing exemplary attitude and service for the day.
- Knowledge of all rules is the responsibility of rider/coach.
- Coaching is allowed. Coaches must adhere to page 16 of the CPC Show Jumping Rules. Coaching riders who are on course will constitute outside assistance, and may result in elimination.
- Medical armbands must be worn at all times while mounted.
- Show numbers to be worn at all times while mounted.
- Minimum 3 riders to run a class
- Awards to be presented after each division. Ribbons to 6th. Prizes for Championship Pony & Horse.

RULING ON FALLS DURING BCLM REGIONAL JUMPING CHAMPIONSHIPS

(As per Equine Canada Rules)

ARTICLE G103 FALLS

After being eliminated for a fall, the rider may not remount in the ring. Any rider who does remount in the ring after a fall will be eliminated from all classes in that ring for the remainder of the day. A rider who remounts after a fall and takes another obstacle will be disqualified from the remainder of the competition.

Appendix III: Coaching Guidelines.

The role of a coach is to assist the rider

1. In the warm-up area
 2. In the course walk
 3. Assist rider in learning the rules of competition before competition begins.
- The presence of a coach at a Show Jumping Competition is to promote safety, good sportsmanship and good horsemanship in the warm-up area and the competition ring.
 - The coach is not present to give a riding lesson in the warm up area.
 - Teams/individuals may share a coach
 - The coach's name(s) must be included on the entry form. Any substitution or addition of coach must be reported to the organizing committee prior to the start of the competition.
 - The coach must be familiar with and comply with the current CPC for Show Jumping Competitions and should assist riders in learning these rules before the competition begins.
 - During any post round briefing the coach must not interfere with the riders care for their horse.

The duties of a coach shall be limited to the jumping phases of competitions and may include:

1. Observing, but not participation in, any pre-competitive soundness check and any daily soundness checks.
2. Accompanying competitors during course inspection or at any other subsequent times that the courses are open for walking, during which they may give advice and coach
3. Assisting competitors in the designated Exercise Area.
4. Briefly meet with the rider after the round for feedback on the round, if the rider desires. This meeting will be held in or very near by the gate to, the Exercise Area; and under no circumstances will interfere with the care of the horse. Coaches who are interfering may be asked to leave the exercise area
5. If necessary, a coach may lead a competitor's horse into the arena.

A coach may request an adjustment of tack from the Chief Steward.

1. If permission is granted, after the adjustment is made, the competitor must return to the Chief Steward for a safety check of the adjustment.
2. Permission for changes must be requested before the change is made.

At all times coaches must be aware of the unauthorized assistance rule. They must not enter the stable area except at authorized visiting times.

Violations of these coaching guidelines will be penalized by the chief steward/judge/ground jury.

I have read and understand the above and agree to abide by these guidelines and by the competition rules.
