- Be the first in the ring
- Walk smartly
 - don't drag your horse behind you
 - o walk briskly
 - o don't have tension on the reins
 - \circ $\;$ be attentive; know where the judge is at all times
- always show with a stick
- keep the forefeet together, hind slightly separate
- have the head slightly down; this creates a smoother topline
- when the judge is in front of the horse, don't stand between the judge and the horse
- when the judge is behind, move off to the side
- Jogging:
 - Movement means a lot
 - Often, the more forward, the better
 - Practice this before you get into the ring
 - Make sure the horse is sharp to your aids, but not explosive
- Think about the horse you've beside in the class; place yourself by the ugliest horse
- Know where the judge is
